U.S. Supreme Court Upholds Partial Birth Abortion Ban!

Pro-Lifers Command Respect At Capital

About 150 pro-lifers from around the state gathered inside the Capitol Building in Des Moines to show legislators they are a force to be reckoned with at the annual Prayer for Life in January.

As long as the people upstairs feel safe in their jobs, we aren't going to see any changes," said Bryan English, a District Representative for popular pro-life U.S. Rep. Steve King of the Fifth District. English also noted the turnout for the event is getting bigger every year.

Speakers for the rally, including Kim Lehman, President of Iowa Right to Life; Fr. Mike Peters; Sally Proctor from Iowans for Life; and Rep. Betty De Boef (R-76th District); called for the end to the violence of abortion, alternatives to Embryonic Stem Cell Research and a new respect for the human person.

For many, the event was a family affair. Jeane Bishop of Des Moines, who attended with her daughter Sydney and

Partial Birth Abortion is finally banned in the United States, thanks to a recent ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court. President Bush's new appointments made the difference and for the first time in years the United States can be proud of a ruling.

Sadly, the new ban will not prevent abortion in the second and third trimester, as Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton allow abortionists to kill unborn children up to the ninth month. The ban is directed toward only one procedure.

It is because of their militant extremism that it has taken this long to successfully stop this one procedure called partial birth abortion. Muscatine Teens Organize Right To Life Affiliate

Andrew Rauenbuehler has always had an interest in politics. And in the summer of 2006, when the teenager from Muscatine was browsing through the Iowa Right to Life website, he came across the link to information on how to start a chapter.

A few weeks later, Muscatine Right to Life was born.

Missouri Pulls Planned Parenthood Funding

Missouri Governor Matt Blunt pulled taxpayer funding of Planned Parenthood, according to an article in The Joplin Globe, March 20, 2007. Planned Parenthood of Southwest Missouri had been getting \$27,000 funding for the "Show Me Healthy Women Program" for breast-cancer and cervical-cancer screenings. The screenings will be transferred to Ozark Tri-County Health Care and Jordan Valley Community Health Center, so women with objections to Planned Parenthood, will not have to go to their offices for testing. "Patients should not have to go to an abortion clinic to access life-saving tests," Blunt said in a written statement to the Globe.

MLK, Jr.'s Niece Gives Pro-Life Talks

The niece of Martin Luther King, Jr. is speaking out against abortion. "Abortion is not a civil right. How can the dream survive if you're killing babies?" asked Alveda King, to a group of 100 in Springettsbury Township, Pennsylvania April 13, according to The York Daily Record. King, who had two abortions in the 70s, would have had a third, but her boyfriend and grandfather refused to pay \$250 for the abortion. "Today, that baby is 30 years old, and he's beautiful," said King.

King's speeches are causing discomfort for Planned Parenthood, as she talks about post-abortion syndrome and also Planned Parenthood's racist founder, Margaret Sanger and racist legacy. (More info at www.kingforamerica.org)

Abortions Decline in Wisconsin

Abortions in Wisconsin declined for the third straight year, with 9,580 reported abortions in 2006, down from 9,817 in 2005, according to the Associate Press, April 10, 2007. Of the 2005 abortions, 57 percent were performed on women between the age 20 and 29.

Sue Armacost, legislative director for Wisconsin Right to Life, told the AP the decline is due to an increase in pro-life young people as well as a 1996 state law that provides more info to women considering abortion and a 24-hour interval before the abortion is performed. Abortions in Wisconsin hit a high of 21,754 in 1980.

Planned Parenthood Nets \$350,000 Grant in Iowa

Planned Parenthood of Greater Iowa received a \$350,000 grant from the Kresge Foundation, *The Des Moines Register* reported April 12, 2007. The grant is to create a new education resource and advocacy center in Des Moines.

Planned Parenthood chapters in Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Florida and California have been past recipients of the foundation's largess, to the tune of hundreds of thousands of dollars annually. The Foundation was started by the founder of Kresge stores, which later became Kmart. However, the independent foundation is not affiliated with the current Kmart stores.
